

Beginning of Lent

This year Easter will be early, on 31st March. So, we have already entered the season of Lent, with Pancake Day last Tuesday, and Ash Wednesday on 14th February. (I had a waffle with strawberries, almost as good as pancakes...) In the early Christian church, Lent did not have a fixed period of time, but eventually Lent began 6 weeks (42 days) before Easter, which resulted in 36 days of fasting (Sundays did not count). People were accustomed to fasting and they wanted to fast as long as Jesus did when he was in the desert. In the 7th century, 4 days were added before the first Sunday in Lent, to get to the number 40. (We know today that the exact number is not all that relevant, because 40 is a symbol. Forty days means a long time, as does 40 years of wandering in the wilderness: a very long time.) In Rome, people who had been excluded from Holy Communion – because of their misbehaviour – began their period of public repentance on the first day of Lent. They prepared for their restoration to the sacrament of the Eucharist. These penitents were sprinkled with ashes, dressed in sackcloth, and required to remain separate from their congregation until they were reconciled with the community on Maundy Thursday, the Thursday before Easter. These practices fell into disuse in the 8th to 10th century). The beginning of the period of repentance then became symbolised by placing ashes on the heads of the entire congregation.

In the <u>Roman Catholic Church</u> today, ashes are applied in the shape of a <u>cross</u> on the forehead of each worshipper.

Way of Life

If I thought that the Christian faith was only concerned with churchgoing or looking after a pious minority I would have very little use for it. But it isn't. Christianity is concerned with the whole of life, from falling in love to the way you bring up your children, from the use you make of your money or talents to the way you treat your neighbour, from the mystery of birth to the mystery of death and with everything that happens in between.

The Christian faith was a way of life before it became a religion. It still is. You cannot take a certain proportion of life and call that 'religious' any more than you can give God an hour or two on Sunday and consider the rest of life your own. The way you live, the way you treat others – these are the important things whether you profess to be a believer or not.

The way in which we behave is an accurate indication of what we really think about God.

The ashes serve as a reminder of our mortality, and often applied with some variation of the words, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." Ash Wednesday Services are also held in Anglican, Lutheran, and some other Protestant churches, but not in the UCA in Albany region. Maybe we need no extra reminder that 'we too will die'.

I suggest we fast from sad thoughts and rejoice in Summer!
