Sometimes I wonder how much of our attention is drawn to far away problems, like overseas wars, Eastern States floods and so on, and how much time we spend on taking action to tackle problems in our own Albany community. Every few months regional and local representatives of aid organisations meet, to compare notes, to inform each other of changes in support on offer, changes in organisations etc. I could not attend the most recent meeting, because it clashed with a Communion Service I lead at Craigcare (with Doreen playing the piano). I have the minutes of that meeting and am sharing some of the things that came up. There is a lot of methamphetamine in town at the moment. Homelessness is at crisis level, with young mothers and babies being affected. A lack of viable properties and increase in rent causes people to leave their homes. Some caravan parks refuse to take local people, but Mt Barker Caravan Park accepts them. There are wait lists, which prioritise vulnerable people and people at risk. People are supposed to make an appointment to see emergency relief people at St Vincent the Paul, but many people drop in, maybe because they cannot afford a mobile phone. They need a volunteer truck driver to pick up and drop off furniture for people finding accommodation. A lot of people use 'buy now, pay later' schemes to buy daily necessities, and Anglicare Financial Counselling have a three-week waiting list for appointments. Many people have already received their 6 times per year limit in emergency relief, and St John's too see a significant increase in people

Lisa, in her new office, helps people with Foodbank vouchers, as well as with applications for a NILS loan (a loan without interest). In exceptional cases overnight accommodation or petrol or is funded. This Lenten period, can we think of anything (more) each of us individually, our (grand)children, or congregations, could contribute to relieve the pressure on the poor and/or marginalised people in Albany?
