Psalm 4

When I call, give me answers, God, take my side! Once, in a tight pace, you gave me room; now I am in trouble again: grace me! Hear me!

You rabble – how long do I put up with your scorn? How long will you lust after lies? How long will you live crazed by illusion?

We cannot know the trouble the psalmist faced. It could be family discord, or neighbourly conflict. We do know that the author turns to God for rescue and relief. As is the case with most Psalms, they speak about real struggles and cries for deliverance (salvation). When we experience hardship in our lives we can find comfort in their openness, their directness. Reading a Psalm like this can help us realise that we are not alone. When we read the response to pain the writer finds, we can find hope to find ways to endure our own suffering. The opening words of Psalm 4 are straightforward. The situation is so dire there is no time to waste in calling upon God for assistance. "Give me answers, God!"

You were on my side before, so I count on you again. The psalmist turns to his attackers next. People who have shamed him. Read the rest of the Psalm, set for this week, and you will find that he is one of the people God has 'set apart'. One of the faithful. Despite his problems he calls to God, fully expecting God to act. This confidence runs through the whole Psalm.

Soul Soil

In Genesis 2:8; we read about the Lord God planted a garden. Faith is the soil in which all other virtues grow. In 2 Peter 1:5-7, we are told to have soul soil of faith and to let it produce increasing amounts of virtue, knowledge, self-control, perseverance, godliness, brotherly kindness, and love. Most of us have done gardening, and you know that weeds come up naturally, but crops and flowers need to be cultivated to control the weeds. The weeds represent the things that grow in our garden that can stifle the growth of virtues that God wants to see us practising in our life's journey.

We are a part of Gods Garden, and He is trying to help us cultivate out the weed's in our lives (garden), and strive to have a deeper faith and for us to be aware that Christ is abiding in us, being fruitful, and producing other virtues that God loves. We need have the desire to open our hearts to allow Him to do more of the work He needs to in our lives.

God is indeed present, with us and in us, through the living Christ, by the Holy Spirit. So, we can be thankful, and remember that God is an ever-present help in times of trouble. When difficulties threaten to overtake us, may we cling to the certainty of God's loving presence, I pray.
