God is Love

There is not much in the daily news that can remind us of the love of God for the world in which we live. Where can we look for light in dark times? How can we break free from the feelings of anxiety and fear? The answer seems quite simple. We remind ourselves that God is love, that we are loved, and that our calling is to love God, and our neighbour as ourselves. We are loved, not on the condition that we need to earn or deserve it. We are worthy to give and receive love just as we are. God is love, God is love in action, as it was shown in the life and death, the ministry of Jesus, who is our Lord of Love and Prince of Peace. We cannot end the conflicts in the world. It is hard enough to resolve tension or accept differences between us and our close relatives and friends. Much as we would like to make the Kingdom a reality, we can't. We don't have to, either. I said finding light in dark times seems simple for a reason. Loving, putting love into action, is not that easy. We may have been hurt in the past, and opening ourselves to the love of others may make us feel too vulnerable. We may avoid loving relationships because intimacy may demand more courage to take relational risks than we currently have. This is where fear of not being loved, fear of death, fear of life itself can rear their heads, and all we see around us seems ugly and unworthy, even the reflection of our own face

The Dark Night

Does God sometimes seem to have gone AWOL on you? It happened to Jesus and will happen to you! On the cross. Jesus shouted, "Eloi, Eloi, Iema sabachthani?" (Jesus native language translated as "My God, my God, why have you deserted me?" Mark 15:34). In his Garden prayer Jesus had surrendered to God's way for him and he expected God's presence and help on the path ahead. But, approaching death on the cross, Jesus uttered this cry of abandonment. Had Jesus lost his faith? This is the only prayer of Jesus where he does not call God "Abba" an intimate term similar to "Dad" and Mark records no further words of Jesus, only says, "Jesus shouted and then died." (v37). Some say that this was the moment Jesus was separated from God for the sins of the world. That, I suppose, is a possible interpretation. But not likely. Jesus takes his Good Friday cry of abandonment from the opening words of Psalm 22. Today, the Fifth Sunday of Easter, Psalm 22 makes a reappearance in the Lectionary. This time the words of hope and faith that end the Psalm are read. Jesus would have known, and had in mind, all of Psalm 22 when he quoted the opening words. If so, his prayer of abandonment was also a word of hope: Psalm 22:24 'When I cried out, he listened". Jesus, on the cross, had faith to know that God was present in his absence and would hear him. If your faith is like Jesus, when you experience God's absence and silence in a time of need, deep down you know this is a 'dark night' leading you into the perfect light. Jesus believed, even in the darkness, he would rise from death. In a time of darkness remember Jesus' faith: death precedes resurrection. Jesus is the risen Lord and is the reliable guide for you through the dark night.
