Psalm 1

On Monday I will board a plane to fly to the Netherlands, returning on 29th May. While on leave, you will find the 'front page' as put together by Lisa, with the Psalm for that week's Sunday and the comments from 'With Love to the World'. This Sunday we read Psalm 1. This Psalm is the introduction to the book of Psalm

This Psalm is the introduction to the book of Psalms, known as the Psalter. It is also an introduction to the spiritual life. It offers a choice: we can follow the path of the wicked or walk the path of God. Of course, this is not much of a choice. Who would choose the way of the wicked – the way of darkness and evil, cruelty, violence, and revenge? No doubt we will choose to be path of God, the road of and to light and goodness. forgiveness, and peace. We are not stupid. Hmmm. We are human. That is where the trouble begins. "Happy are those who do not ...take the path that sinners tread". Who is able to not sin at all, ever? There is no way we can avoid forgetting about the other person, or about God. There is no way we can escape our own blind spots or always be Spirit filled and patient, kind, gentle, and so on. We make mistakes intentionally or thoughtlessly; we see mistakes in hindsight or not at all. We can only aspire to live life as Jesus did: without doing harm to other, God or self. So, does this mean that this Psalm (and with it the entire process of spiritual growth) tells us we

Inner Reinforcement

Without God's inner reinforcement through the Spirit, Christianity remains just a beautiful ideal that nobody can live up to. People may admire the character of Christ, may see that his way of living is the right one and may even try to follow him, but unless God can implant the moral power within a person the vision of being a Christian soon fades and becomes just another discarded idea.

Christianity is not meant to be a beautiful ideal that is impossible to live out in practice. It is the way of real, happy, constructive living in harmony with both God and our fellow human beings. Unfortunately, because of the selfishness and evil both around us and within us, we find ourselves too weak, too cowardly and too tied by our old ways of thinking and feeling to embark on this real living until God intervenes.

To anyone who means business and sincerely wants to live life in the new way, God is prepared to give the inner reinforcement of his own Spirit.
