## **Being Called**

Last week, people in church heard the story of Samuel's call to become prophet, seer, priest, and Israel's last Judge. In other words, full time, lifetime servant of God. We too are called to serve in some way or another. After the service last Sunday, we spoke briefly about how the response to this call changes. As youngsters we don't really know how to respond, and need examples to follow, or instructions. As we grow older, we become models of servanthood ourselves, and many of you can see how this worked out in your children and (great) grandchildren. They may not go to church, but they will have learned to be kind, considerate, and they know the difference between 'right' and 'wrong'. When super senior age creeps up on all of us, we cannot do all the things we did before, and our response becomes limited, but we don't become useless. I tell people in age care that they have a different call to fulfill as employers of the people who care for them. Without residents, these people would not have a job! When no longer able to walk, or needing help with basic things necessary for daily life, we can still say, 'thank you'. Even if we cannot speak any longer, we most likely can still smile. As an expression of kindness and goodwill, or as a way of saying 'good morning' a smile always communicates some level of affection for the other person. After the service last week, I remembered a

### **Family Issues**

Jesus problems began to mount soon after he began his healing and teaching ministry. Crowds flocked to hear him and Jesus and his disciples were so busy they couldn't even find the time to eat. However, these popularity, space and time issues were the least of Jesus problems - the religious leaders had began to plot together to kill Jesus and claimed that he was in league with demons. Even that was not his chief problem his family was! Jesus' mother and brothers (Joseph was probably dead) "thought he was crazy and went to get him under control". Mary was accompanied by the muscle of Jesus 'brothers in order to bring him 'under control 'and drag him home. But the crowd was too big and the house too small for them to enter and force Jesus home, so they sent a message to him to come out to them. Jesus was given the message, "Your family are outside and want to see you." The crowd knew that, in their society, there was no higher obligation than to family. Jesus did not comply with the summons. The crowd would have been shocked and dumfounded when Jesus then effectively 'disowned' his family saying, "Who is family to me? All those who hear and obey God's call on their lives are my mother, brothers and sisters." This would have broken Mary's heart and probably angered Jesus brothers. It was a serious family breakdown. Repairs must have been made because his mother was at the cross and tomb and one of his brothers became a leader in the early church. Why did Mark tell this story? He wanted to show that Jesus, whatever the odds, was determined to stay faithful to God's call on his life. All of Jesus' new family are called in the same way, to take up their own cross and follow Jesus. Are you faithful, like Jesus?
