Psalm 24

Leslie F Brandt writes Psalm 24 in new words: Let us not forget that this world and everything in it belongs to God. But not all of this world's citizens recognise or give allegiance to their Creator. Who are the ones who truly love and serve God? They are the people wo discover and live within God's purposes for their lives. They are the people whose hearts and hands are dedicated to God's will for them. They are the people who turn away from self-centred concerns to live for those around them. They can count on God's perpetual blessings. They have been delivered from anxiety to focus their efforts on communicating God's eternal love to people around them. Let us look up and live! God is present in all His glory and majesty. Let us let go and celebrate! Our loving Lord is here with us and will manifest Himself through us. We represent Him in all His saving power. We are His beloved and empowered servants in this world that He created. For many people it is difficult to think of God without having some mental image. Jesus addressed God as Abba, Father. We still do that today. This does not mean that God is a Father like a human father. God is much, much, greater than that, source of all, lifegiving love. We can see this love in nature, we can feel it for other people or pets, we can hear it in beautiful music, smell it in the delicate perfume of a rose or the smell of a heartening winter stew. God's love is present in

Luke 7:36-38

"A woman in that town who lived a sinful life learned that Jesus was eating at the Pharisee's house, so she came there with an alabaster jar of perfume. As she stood behind him at his feet weeping, she began to wet his feet with her tears. Then she wiped them with her hair, kissed them and poured perfume on them. Jesus is having dinner at the home of a religious leader, a Pharisee. This is not a dinner as we understand them. It's not just a private function for invited guests alone. These gatherings tended to be more public events where a teacher is asked to another leader's home and they have a public conversation, people come to listen and watch. There were many usual practices around these meals, and next week we will read that the host, Simon, refused Jesus the usual hospitality rituals reserved for visiting teachers. The type of meal and gathering that this represented makes a little more sense of a random person entering the room and anointing Jesus' feet. We know very little about this lady other than that she had a "sinful" reputation. Yet into this space, surrounded by people she knew would judge her, she makes a quite remarkable effort to anoint Jesus' feet and weep in his presence. She demonstrates what we should all know today. No one is beyond the reach of Jesus, no one is outside his interest or care, everyone is welcome. Your reputation and past do not exclude you from Jesus, in fact, if you are acutely aware of your sins, you are in the right place with the right attitude. Come into Jesus' presence today and experience his welcome and grace.
