Psalm 89

Here is James Taylor's interpretation of the verses this week's Psalm. God is speaking.

"I have chosen my successor," says God. "I have chosen you. You will take my place. For years, I have taught you my vision; now I want you to take it forward into the future. To avoid being controlled by bureaucrats, to protect yourself against fast-talking promoters and bottom-line economists, you must ask yourself what I would do. By keeping me always in mind, our reputations will both grow. What I have started, you will continue; through you my influence will spread. I have been your launching pad - now it's up to you to carry on. I want to be proud of you. As long as you pursue my vision, you will prosper. But if you wander off my way, if you lust after competitive advantage and chase after quick profits, if you sell out to other gods and other goals, then you will destroy yourself. You will lose all credibility; you will go ethically bankrupt. Even so, I will never turn against you. I have taken you into my family; you are a member of my household. I have promised it; I do not lie."

A house is built with building materials, but until it is filled with people, with members of a household, it will be just that: a house. God is speaking to David, naming him as his representative on earth. David's line and his throne are metaphors for the eternal family

I do not walk on water Except in winter. When ice makes the miracle more natural. To me, these days, natural miracles are better, Signifying lessons to live rather than shortcuts to take, A more subtle yet more real magic. For me, nature is already as supernatural As it needs to be. The simplest, humblest things — Green moss on grey rock, Spotted turtle basking in a shaft of sunlight — They are true signs and wonders, Holy, significant, wonderful. I used to crave miracles to prove something (most especially, myself, my faith, my tribe's exceptionalism). Now, instead of the miracle, I try to keep my eyes open for the meaningful. That these sounds in air or these marks on paper Could bear my heart to yours, Or bring what you see to my eyes ... what Could be more miracle?
