#### Pentecost 10

The repentance of a broken heart, some of us have been there. The moment of crying out to God, when there are no more excuses, no blame, no story telling laden with judgements, simply the raw reckoning that our own actions have caused harm; and for this. We come, humbly, to lay it down and repent. Psalm 51 is also just such a moment in David's life. He comes to the realisiation that he was never too far from God's grace to be worthy of love. We need this recognition for ourselves, too. Yet whilst we receive God's grace, we are not protected from the consequences of our actions, for they still must be faced. What we know from Psalm 51 is that no matter, how far we stray from the ideal or how many people we hurt, our hearts will (or should) break as soon as we reckon with our actions and their consequences. The Hebrew word for "sin" is chatta'ah: it means "to go wrong", or "to miss the mark". In reality, we all do so to one degree or another. It is a step on the way to recovery and reconciliation to allow our heart to break as we come to terms with our own capacity and rest in the unending grace extended to us.

### **The Parental Hangover**

Because Christ said that people must become 'as little children' (that is, to repudiate all the sham, compromise and cynicism of adulthood) before they can play their part in the Kingdom with simplicity and sincerity, some have supposed that he places a premium upon human immaturity. It is ludicrous to suppose that a sensible God would wish adult men and women to crawl about in spiritual rompers in order to preserve a rather sentimental Father/child relationship. Indeed, experience shows that it is only the mature Christian who can begin to see a little of the size of the Father. They may have previously thought that the comparison of the relationship between a toddler and their adult parent with their own relationship towards God was rather an exaggeration of that gulf, in intelligence at least. In their growing maturity, however, it can be seen that Christ in his kindness of heart has certainly not exaggerated the awe-inspiring disparity between God and his people. To have a God then, who is as much or more our superior than we are the superior of an infant child crawling on the floor, is not to hold a childish concept of God but rather the reverse. It is only when we limit the mind's stirrings of its Maker by imposing upon its half-forgotten images of our own earthly parents that we grow frustrated in spirit and wonder why for us the springs of worship and love do not flow. We must leave behind 'parental hangover' if we are to find a 'big enough' God.
