

Pentecost 13

This a psalm of praise and thanksgiving. It reminds us that God is gracious and merciful, provides food, remembers the promises made to the people of Israel and its leaders and has redeemed the people. The psalmist concludes with a well-known proverb- "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom". In contemporary English this is a bit misleading. Why should we fear a God who is good, generous, loving, kind? Why fear a God who remembers and keeps promises? The meaning of fear has narrowed over the centuries to mostly mean "to be frightened of"- we fear crocodiles, terrorists and in my case needles- or in the case of my daughter, spiders. Some fears are rational, others just are. But this is not the fear the psalmist speaks of. This is an older sense of "fear"-an awareness of the awesomeness, the power of Godlike the fear of a volcano, or a giant wave (only much, much bigger). Sometimes as followers of Jesus we get a bit too" good buddies" with God (like "God is my dad"). The psalmist reminds us that God is so much more – so far beyond our imagining. May God continue to inspire in us a sense of this "fear"
