

The first sounds of crickets, the first roses.... I thought of this spring poem by William Wordsworth. (Great name for a poet, Worthy of Words, don't you think?)

'I heard a thousand blended notes, while in a grove I sate reclined.

In that sweet mood when pleasant thoughts bring sad thoughts to the mind.

To her fair works did Nature link the human soul that through me ran;

And much it grieved my heart to think what man has made of man.

Through primrose tufts, in that green bower, the periwinkle trailed its wreaths;

And 'tis my faith that every flower enjoys the air it breathes. The birds around me hopped and played, their thoughts I cannot measure: –

But the least motion which they made it seemed a thrill of pleasure.

The budding twigs spread out their fan, to catch the breezy air; And I must think, do all I can, that there was pleasure there. If this belief from heaven be sent, if such be Nature's holy plan, Have I not reason to lament what man has made of man?' Sadness in the midst of beauty, death as part of life, spontaneity smothered by inhibitions, we all know it from experience. Yet, in spite of all the grief we can feel about how human beings (mis)treat each other or themselves, there is more good than evil, there is hope. Hope I find in faith in love.

Offering Our Gifts

We are sometimes overwhelmed by people who seem to be so capable and appear to have so much to give and to contribute. We may come across such people in the workplace, the sporting club, the community organisation and the church. Sometimes a member in our family seems to be so much more gifted and even closer to home, our marriage partner may seem to have skills and abilities that leave us feeling second-rate or even guite useless. In spite of these feelings of negativity, we need to realise that we can all play a part, can all contribute and can all bring something from our unique life experience. Henri Nouwen affirmingly notes that 'we all have gifts to offer and a need to receive'. One may be able to offer warmth, while the other contributes discipline. One may provide sensitivity while the other provides direction. Some are good managers. Others are creative. Some can provide stability, others openness and flexibility. Some dream. Others lead. Some provide a presence while others possess a practical wisdom. The possibilities are endless. But when those with particular gifts, abilities and functions are prepared to harmonise with others who have differing contributions to make, then purposeful activity becomes a possibility, beauty comes into view and the magic begins. Thus those who seem to be so sure of themselves need to invite the gift of the other. And those who are more timid need to contribute their part so that a greater good may emerge.
