### **Ageing Well**

Well, ageing well.... Life expectancy – at birth – was 25 years in ancient times, in the Roman Empire in Jesus' day. By the Middle Ages this had gone up to about 33 years and in the early 1900s a baby could expect to live to around 55 years in the early 1900s. All on average, of course. These days in Australia, again at birth, women can expect to live over 85 years and men around 81 years. (The difference between genders stems from risk taking behaviour, which is higher among young men than among young women. There are differences between first and second Australians too. which can be explained by a number of different factors, health care, education, living condition, employment etc.) Most of us white fellas have access to good medical care, and medical science has extended our years as well as the quality of our latter days of life. We can be grateful for longer lives. Yet we may at times wonder what it means to live longer than our ancestors, ask ourselves how to give meaning to these extra years. We know that being seventy or eighty is nothing strange. The bonus years offer another stage of life with its opportunities and possibilities. We can welcome this extra time, with grandchildren, often great grandchildren and the wisdom that can come with the thinning of our hair. We could be grateful for the gifts we are offered in so many ways. There is a cost, of course, too. These super senior years inevitably bring with them loss and decline. Therefore, we need courage and hope facing another day, another year. Lengthening of our years alone cannot satisfy the hunger of our human hearts. We can live
