Whatever befalls the earth befalls the children of the earth. This we know. The earth does not belong to us; we belong to the earth. This we know. We do not weave the web of life, we are merely a strand in it. Whatever we do to the web, we do to ourselves.'

They need someone to mentor faith, someone they can trust, someone who cares about them, to love them unconditionally and to help them discover the meaning of life.

A Consuming Fire

Those of old were not exaggerating when they said, "Our God is a consuming fire". Many people of sensitivity and perception whether they have a religious faith or not, view with dismay the growing materialism of this age. To anyone who is the least alive to the contemporary God, the general life of this country, despite many virtues, exhibits all the symptoms of God-deficiency. For the present generation is, albeit unconsciously, attempting to prove we can live by bread alone. The good life is conceived almost entirely in terms of creature comforts, labour saving appliances, better clothes, better and longer holidays, more money to spend and more leisure to enjoy. None of these things is wrong in itself, but when they are assumed to satisfy every desire, aspiration and ambition we are surely right to be alarmed at the grip of materialism. When possessions, pleasure and the thought of physical security fill a person's horizon, we cease to ask ourselves such basic questions as "what am I?" or "what am I here for?" Modern mankind can and may gain the whole world but will lose their soul in doing so.
