Refining Fire

The prophet Malachi does not get as much attention as we might give him today, with his plea for the people (I read 'all people') and the priests in particular, to return to the God who loves them. He writes Where is the God of Justice? Well, pay attention! I am sending my Messenger to prepare the way for me, the One you seek will suddenly come to the Temple, the Messenger of the Covenant whom you long for will come, says YHWH Omnipotent. Who can endure the day of the Coming? Who can stan firm when that One appears? That day will be like a smelter's fire, a launderer's soap. The One will preside as refiner and purifier (...) refining the priests like gold and silver – then they will once again make offerings to YHWH in righteousness.

The people of Malachi's day like those of Jesus' time, longed for God to come and deliver them from their oppressors. These days our oppressors are not foreign armies, but individualism, consumerism, and all the spin off effects these have, like selfishness and overindulgence. So, we might long for God to come and deliver us as well. When God would deliver the people in antiquity, God would return to the Temple; the covenant would be completed, the kingdom of David restored, and God's faithful would dwell in peace and prosperity. Malachi throws in a warning. God's coming will not be pleasant, it will be like a refiner's fire. The prophet Isaiah shares his experience (Isa 6:1-7). When he encounters God, he also sees clearly his own condition. "I saw God, high and lifted up (...) Woe is me, I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips." When we experience God's presence, inevitably we also become aware of the parts of ourselves that are not in line with the 'god-like' person we are meant to be. The refining fire, stinging soap, is needed to get rid of the

Perseverance

If we have caught a vision of God's purposes in the world, we can persevere against great odds.

There are no cheap victories in the Christian faith. Hence all the huffing and puffing of the 'name it and claim it' gospel is hopelessly off track. Christianity had its beginnings in the suffering and death of Jesus of Nazareth. It has a long history of martyrs. The Christian faith therefore is much more one of perseverance than of conquests. Christians are the little flock in a fallen world. They are called to a servant role and are challenged to be salt and light in our troubled times.

Therefore, Christians are called to faithfulness and perseverance no matter what happens. We are reminded that 'we continue to act with maximum perseverance... in spite of the absence of temporal effect'.

Reflection: The act of perseverance can only be an act of faith.
