




## Lent 3

In many countries today, governments are moving toward autocracy (dictatorship) or oligarchic (rule by a few wealthy people). The prophet Jeremiah, in his age said: "Were the rulers ashamed when they committed abomination? No, they did not know how to blush". Amos complained that the rich sell the poor for silver and barter the needy for a pair of shoes. We are millennia removed from the ages of these prophets, but their sharp accusations are as relevant as ever.

On the day of his assassination in Memphis, Dr. King called his office to give them his coming Sunday's sermon title. It was this: "Why America may be going to hell." King's popularly had faded. Since his "Beyond Vietnam" speech, in which he condemned the war, most of his white liberal support vanished. He was bitterly criticized by many civil rights movement's leaders. He connected domestic oppression with international aggression. Dr. King recognized that ending racial discrimination nationally was not enough. Something more fundamental was at stake. He began to speak about greedy capitalism. He was accused of no longer preaching, but meddling. Yet, as the prophets of old show us, Jesus followers need to interfere in the ways money becomes the ultimate authority to decide what is of value. When that happens the poor and the weak become expendable.

There have always been times when people in power were cruel and deceitful. Never before has a world leader (albeit not elected) stated, "The fundamental weakness of
