Easter

You can find the cover painting in the Musée d'Orsay, on the left bank of the Seine. It was painted in 1898 by a relatively unknown Swiss artist, Eugène Burnand. He was an old-fashioned realist. The Disciples didn't impress its first viewers. Burnand's style was already considered passé. However, people who have seen it say that viewing this painting is a powerful - spiritual - experience. Some people find it the greatest Easter painting ever made. What we see is that first light, early dawn colours the clouds. Peter and John rush to Jesus' tomb. Mary Magdalene just told them that she and the other women have found it empty. Her words are ringing in their ears, while their faces and their bodies show they aren't sure they can believe her. John wrings his hands. He was with Jesus when he died on the cross, the only disciple who stayed by his side to the end. He looks like he can barely dare to hope that Jesus might be alive again.

And there is Peter. John was Jesus' only faithful disciple. Peter was the only one to deny – three times – that he even knew Jesus. Peter looks terrified, hopeful, ashamed, desperate, all at once.. He is not sure what to believe. Alive? Yes, please, and oh no... Peter's hand grasps his chest, as if searching for the courage he did not have just nights earlier. The two men lean forward, walk briskly, ready to break into a run.

The painting is a study in anxious anticipation. Do we recognise any of the beautifully depicted emotions? Do we too hope against all hope that 'Christ is risen'? The painting does not show women, there is no tomb, no gardener.

Easter Thoughts

Easter faith involves readiness to encounter Jesus as 'a living personal presence'. It is not primarily about respecting his heroic witness, or even about contemplating and applying his remarkable teaching. Believers learn to experience his presence among them in every age as they discern their purpose and mission in life. We, as worshippers, say "Amen" to the reality of that presence when we gather for the Eucharist on Easter Sunday and every Sunday — remembering and celebrating the resurrection of Jesus. Take some time to reflect on the following:

Holy Thursday focus: we encounter Jesus around the table with his friends and the one who would betray him, washing their feet, celebrating the Last Supper, the Eucharist, and inviting his friends to do the same in memory of him. Bring to mind and give thanks for family and friends with whom you share a meal.

Good Friday focus: we encounter Jesus as he is lifted up on the cross. How might we lift up the spirits of those who are suffering greatly at this time?

Easter Saturday focus: we encounter Jesus in this in-between time, this time of waiting. Let's not be so focused on the future or the past that we miss the gifts offered in the in-between moments. Be attentive to what you see and how you feel at this moment.

Easter Sunday focus: we encounter Jesus as the Risen one, the one who has overcome death, who has fulfilled his promise and who brings a message of hope and peace. Create a space somewhere at home during this Easter time and place at its centre something which symbolizes new life or promises kept or hope and peace. Trish Bird and Annette Schneider.
