

Easter 6

When we pray with the psalmist for all nations to praise God. I wonder what we imagined that looks like. Is it Jewish praise, through practices guided by the Torah, as perhaps the psalmist might have imagined from their experience? Is it Christian worship, in one of its myriad forms, with Jesus the Christ at its heart in every place? Or is it different in every place, as worship naturally is and continues to evolve to be: authentic, diverse, enthralling the Divine with unlimited variety? How closed is our imagination, when we picture "all nations" giving their allegiance to Holy One? I am intentionally avoiding "God", because that name is so closely associated with the major religions. I wonder what it will look like when "all nations" align themselves with the source of Life, with the One who is Love, Mercy, Justice, Peace? Serve with kindness, not grasp with greed; share generously, not hoard in fear; embrace and draw neighbours close, rather than repel them with arsenal? Is that the Psalmist's dream? Could that be the Dream of Holy One? May Holy One bless us, keep us, beam with love for us. And may we feel that beaming like the warmth of the sun after winter, shining through us into the world

Looking to Pentecost

As we look forward to Pentecost, make us passionate in our faith, strong in our commitment, courageous beyond our imagining, and willing to love and keep on loving, without reservation. Give us tongues of fire, God, not to babble incomprehensibly but to speak out plainly for justice and fairness: to be the voices of those in this world made mute because they are downtrodden and oppressed: to speak the language of peace in a world bombarded by violence and war, arms-deals and greed: to speak of the grace, bewildering in its simplicity, that sets hearts ... and minds ... and souls free, through Jesus. Help us to be ourselves - all that we can be - for you and not some kind of cardboard cut-out or advertiser's dream, going through the motions of life, and not living in life. Help us to be for refugees- people who have often suffered in ways cruel beyond our comprehension and who suffer still the terrible nightmares, and the gnawing sense of loss through death and torture and separation of their families and friends. Spirit of Life, help us never to use mottoes or platitudes to justify national arrogance or racial or religious prejudice, or drumbeating patriotism and blinkered mistrust of even one person you've created in your own image on this planet Earth. Don't let us bind ourselves only to creeds and not to deeds as a church for that would mean that we are not your church - we are just another organization! Help us to be an accepting, embracing fellowship, not an insular one – and to reach out, not to lock out. Help us to say "Sorry" more often, for without confessing from the heart all that has brought us down, and to simply utter "religious" language, is surely a waste of your time. And how can we hope to be embraced by you, when we have let the sun set on our anger with others? How can we go out and preach what we do not practise. If we seem negative and critical, show us how to be more affirming and accepting and positive. Give us a better sense of perspective, by opening our eyes and our hearts to the real suffering around us. Brand us within with Holy fire, so that what is outward – our words and our actions – our joy and enthusiasm – will make it abundantly obvious who we are, and who and what we stand for. God, let not even one person leave worship today, without feeling the warm stirring of your Spirit within, without embracing the same determination and passion that fired the Apostles at that first Christian Pentecost celebration, without recommitting the life you give to your realm.
