

The Sundays after Pentecost are all about growth, which is why our liturgical colour is green. The seed of faith has been sown, as witnessed by the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, but unless that faith is tended and watered, it will bear



no fruit and inevitably cease to exist. In today's Gospel (Luke 9: 52-62) we hear initially of a community's refusal to receive Jesus, yet as Jesus continued on his journey towards Jerusalem, enthusiastic followers promised undying loyalty and commitment. However, the litany of excuses for delayed response earned justifiable rebuke.

In bold relief, the story is about setting priorities for mission and discipleship. It is a tough ask. There is much to consider. Is the sacrificing of everything that matters in life going to be worth it?

Jesus' response to his would-be eager band of followers was blunt, if not brutal: "No one who puts a hand to the plough and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God". (Luke 9: 62) It is 60 years since I made such a choice. In my late teenage years, I was not saddled with the entanglements that come with adult life, so responded freely. Six decades later I have no regrets about what I believed to be God's call, through Jesus. It has not been an easy pathway, but comfort and security were not on offer, just a commitment to the discipleship journey.

Such a call from Jesus is not date-stamped with a best *use* by date. It is life-long. We can all do it until we finally run out of breath. Then we are called to a different kind of journey altogether.

May God's peace be with you all!
