

In the midst of all the information that comes one's way watching the evening news, I find myself entering into a state of disconnect when the finance news comes on, particularly when there is discussion on the state of the stock market.



In more recent times the somewhat erratic

utterances from the elected head of one of the world's largest trading nations sends the stock exchanges of the world into wildly fluctuating panic. There are massive falls, then mild recovery, in response to threats of retaliatory action against others, that as often as not, fail to materialise.

My sense of disconnect is that I have never owned any shares in my life, apart from what the church's beneficiary fund may have invested in for my limited superannuation. The vast majority of the world's population might well wonder, indeed be confused, with our society's fascination with transitory wealth and the glorification of those with incredible material resources. In contrast, those who have little or none, are often portrayed as being undeserving of aid or compassion, indeed, to be pitied.

Today's Gospel story of "The Parable of the Rich Fool" (Luke 12: 13-21) to my mind has many contemporary parallels. There are the family fights, that in some cases last for generations, over perceived rights to inheritance; siblings who refuse to talk to each other because one or other feels they were unjustly dealt with in a parent's Will; or the dramatic expansion of a family business or farm, that turns to sourness, when the dream of future profit fails to materialise.

Neither of my parents had anything when they died. They worked all their lives for the church, but materially had little to show for it, so along with my siblings there was nothing much to inherit. However, as a consequence we had nothing to fight over and happily still talk to each other. What we *do* celebrate is the great resource of insight and commitment to the care of others. That was the inheritance we received, which we all concede in our way is a treasure that is beyond crude market evaluation.

#### **Somewhere Someone**

The kingdom of love is coming because: somewhere someone is kind when others are unkind, somewhere someone shares with another in need, somewhere someone refuses to hate, while others hate, somewhere someone is patient - and waits in love, somewhere someone returns good for evil, somewhere someone serves another, in love, somewhere someone is calm in a storm, somewhere someone is loving everybody.
