# Welcome to our service.

Duke St Church morning tea is on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of the month; Denmark Uniting Church & Lockyer have morning tea after their Service. **20 July 2025.** 





For these past three weeks we have been on a journey through Luke Chapter 10. You may recall last week it was all about a lawyer wanting to know about what he had to do to inherit eternal life. Jesus chose to tell a story about the neighbourly Good Samaritan as a practical example of how to become a disciple.



In today's Gospel (Luke 10: 38-42) it is all about arranging one's life, as Mary arranged hers, so as to be available for Jesus when he was available to her and to not be distracted about other matters.

The story has nothing to do with a dinner party, nor has it anything to do with a fight between two sisters. The passage is there for a reason; an unmistakeable challenge to a male-dominated religious system which placed so little store on the role of women. Here Jesus recognises Mary as a disciple, just as much as Peter James and John and the rest of the Twelve. The challenge is whether the disciples listened to Jesus as intently as Mary had for when one is on a missionary journey - *and aren't we all?* – following a leader requires a close listening to what he or she has to say. So often we allow ourselves to be distracted, as Martha was, for in Luke's fertile imagination Jesus may have beer telling Mary preaching and discipleship were of far great importance that any wonderful creations that might have been emerging from Martha's kitchen.

That is indeed food for thought as we face the very real challenge of being the church in 2025, where none of the old certainties can be taken for granted. In today's Gospel Jesus had come to make some disciples. Mary clearly understood that. Maybe, like us, it took Martha a while longer, but it is never too late to make a change. Blessings.

## The Birds and the Bees

I sometimes view the Valley East of our place, mostly early of a morning. I am amazed at the bird, insect and animal life on display, plus so many beautiful sunrises.

Tiny birds have an inbuilt "computer" or brain which organises their individual growth, plumage, digestion and so on, as well as instructing them as to when and what to eat, how to select a mate (and why!), how to build nests and care for their young. Such a small brain can do all this!

Bees come and go on some of our garden flowers. How many bee hours of collecting a tiny bit of pollen and nectar does it take to make us a spoonful of honey? How do they know what their role in the hive is, how to find their way to and from the flowers? Ants go back and forth over a considerable distance, often just touching another as they pass. What is the "message" they pass on? How many trips do they make in a lifetime?

The Divine Presence, our Creator God, is so evident in the wonder of all of this, and so much more. Life itself is a miracle and one can only say "God is Great"!
