

This week's Gospel from Luke Chapter 12 is all about being alert, being watchful, dressed for action. In other words there is not much room for procrastination if we are in the business of constantly discerning God's will for our lives. The task before us



today is to know something more of "the work that the Lord has given to us..." For that knowledge and awareness is much more than just a "things to do list" around our home or the Church premises; it is about the constant discerning of God's will for our lives. That just does not happen in an instant, it is something of an awareness one accumulates over a life-time, constantly changing and adapting to new circumstance.

I candidated for ministry straight out of high school. I had been a very average student and was so involved in other activities that study was slotted in usually only when the pressure of a deadline loomed. I was more interested in exploring life than exploring books.

However, 61 years ago in my matriculation year (Year 12), I received a call to the ministry that was very strong. I related that to my Headmaster, whose response was that of both surprise and interest: "Hartley, if you can matriculate, it will surely be a miracle..." Well, knowing that matriculation was a pre-requisite to entering university and a requirement for candidature for the ministry, it was game on. Sufficient to say I confounded my critics and my rather dour Headmaster became a believer in miracles. Along the way, as a Methodist, I was drawn deeper into John Wesley's thought. In the depth of the industrial disruption of 18th Century England, with its corresponding disturbance of the religious and social equilibrium, Wesley went direct to the poor and the needy wherever they were.

Wesley's most abiding statement about his life and work was a *Charter for Mission*, of being "ever alert" as our Gospel for today requires of us. It has stood the test of time and remains something we can constantly aspire to in our daily living: "This we believe. Do all the good you can, by all the means you can, in all the ways you can, in all the places you can, to all the people you can, as long as you can..." (Rev John Wesley 1703-1791)
