

The Major Premise

It is probably quite impossible to explain the Christian attitude to the thoroughgoing materialist, simply because the major premise which makes the whole position tenable and satisfactory is God, and the materialist denies such a person's existence. But, speaking as one who did not arrive at his present convictions without a good deal of questing and questioning, I would assure the materialist that their position looks every bit as ridiculous and untenable to those who have some small knowledge of God as the Christian position does to the materialist.
