Have a good look. There is a mirror behind these two figures. The photo was taken in a museum in the Netherlands, where traditional costumes were on display. The mannequins are wearing mourning outfits as were worn in some parts of the country until about a century ago. It would be so easy to see something different, and jump to conclusions, would it not? Noticing differences between people often leads to judgements about the 'other'. We are not just different, but better, somehow. Judgments like this are very common and almost automatic. The Scriptures tell us not to judge, lest we be judged.

This may seem like an impossible ideal, a farfetched hope, but it is possible to learn and to teach 'unity in diversity', as the Uniting Church does.

Unity begins with noticing differences and the realisation that differences are just that: differences. The feelings that come up when we see differences (in appearance, preferences, religion, etc.) need to be recognised for what they are: emotions based on a judgement, or prejudice. The more we become aware of differences and learn to see these as mere differences, the easier it becomes to not judge, and to not be upset, sad, or afraid of other people who seem different. We have much more in common than we may believe. Unity is not only possible, but essential in a world where various forces keep pushing to create division and thus gain power and control over people, over us. Freedom is to be found in faith. Freedom can be created in the one sacred body, the body of Christ, the Church, and spread beyond that. Blessings, Corina
