

History?

Below, you will see a painting of a Dutch family on their way to the funeral of their (stillborn?) baby, about 140 years ago. Dad up front with the tiny casket under his arm, followed by seven downcast children of varying ages and grieving mum at the back of the tragic procession. The picture moved me, when I first spotted it, and it still does, today. The sadness of the children stands out. They cannot laugh and play as they otherwise would. Painful is the contrast with the young woman looking on, holding her baby, as the pale, watery blue colours add to the intensely miserable mood.



Psychiatry

Psychiatry can, and does, remove certain disabilities and resolve certain conflicts, but it cannot by itself supply our standards or values. It cannot answer any questions outside the immediate range of human personality.

I believe that those who would see in modern psychiatry something at once more efficient and more "scientific" than true religion are doomed to disappointment, for however excellent psychiatric methods may be, no adjustment can be provided towards any suprahuman purpose in life and no connection made with any resource outside human personality.

Such further integration may be, and of course sometimes is, provided even unconsciously by the psychiatrist, but that is because he is she is a person of faith themselves and not because they are a practitioner in psychiatry. They have to go beyond their function as a scientist if they are to adjust their patient to a world of spiritual reality.
