

## **Advent Hope**

The first Sunday in Advent traditionally has as its theme 'Hope'.

I came across an old Chinese story about an old farmer who had an old horse to tilling his fields. One day the horse escaped into the hills. The farmer's neighbours sympathised with the old man over his bad luck. The farmer replied, "Bad luck? Good luck? Who knows?" A week later the horse returned with a herd of wild horses from the hills. This time the neighbours congratulated the farmer with his good luck. His reply was, "Good luck? Bad luck? Who knows?" Then, when the farmer's son was trying to tame one of the wild horses, he fell off its back and broke his leg. Everyone thought this was very bad luck. Not the farmer, whose only reaction was, "Bad luck? Good luck? Who knows?". Some weeks later the army marched into the conscripted every able-bodied young man they found living there. When they saw the farmer's son with his broken leg they passed him over. Now was that good luck? Bad luck? Who knows?

Everything that seems evil at first glance may be a good thing in disguise. Everything that may seem good on the surface may really be an evil. So, we are wise to leave the ultimate judgement of what is good and what is evil to the almighty power of Love, God. We can always hope for things that seem bad to take a turn for the better. Likewise, we can always give thanks for things turning out well, when we feared the worst.

## **Deeds**

What we need is to love without getting tired. How does a lamp burn? Through the continuous input of small drops of oil. What are these drops of oil in our lamps? They are the small things of daily life: faithfulness, small words of kindness, a thought for others, our way of being silent, of looking, of speaking, and of acting. Do not look for Jesus away from yourselves. He is not out there; he is among you. Keep your lamp burning and you will recognise him. These words of Jesus, "Even as I have loved you, also love one another," should be not only a light to us, but they should also be a flame consuming the selfishness that prevents the growth of holiness. Jesus "loved us to the end," to the very limit of love: the cross. This love must come from within, from our union with Christ. Loving must be as normal to us as living and breathing, day after day until our death. We do not need to carry out grand things in order to show a great love for God and for our neighbors. It is the intensity of love we put into our gestures that makes them into something beautiful for God. Mother Teresa
