I need peace of mind, and I suspect I am not the only one. I pray for peace, and Pope Francis shared his prayer for peace with the internet world. Here it is.

Lord God of peace, hear our prayer!

We have tried so many times and over so many years to resolve our conflicts by our own powers and by the force of our arms. How many moments of hostility and darkness have we experienced; how much blood has been shed; how many lives have been shattered; how many hopes have been buried... But our efforts have been in vain. Now, Lord, come to our aid! Grant us peace, teach us peace; guide our steps in the way of peace. Open our eyes and our hearts and give us the courage to say: "Never again war!"; "With war everything is lost". Instill in our hearts the courage to take concrete steps to achieve peace.

Lord, God of Abraham, God of the Prophets, God of Love, you created us and you call us to live as brothers and sisters. Give us the strength daily to be instruments of peace; enable us to see everyone who crosses our path as our brother or sister. Make us sensitive to the plea of our citizens who entreat us to turn our weapons of war into implements of peace, our trepidation into confident trust, and our quarrelling into forgiveness.

Keep alive within us the flame of hope, so that with patience and perseverance we may opt for dialogue and reconciliation. In this way may peace triumph at last, and may the words "division", "hatred" and "war" be banished from the heart of every man and woman. Lord, defuse the

## **Prayer and Activism**

It is easier to be a social activist than a person of prayer. The activist can at least see some immediate results even though these may be short-term and project-focused rather than long-term and transformative. The person of prayer seldom sees quick results. The social activist, moreover, is usually lauded for the good work done. The praying person is alone in the struggle of faith and the agony of the heart where no-one sees and no-one applauds.

Thus prayer is made all the harder, for though we desire to be socially valued persons, prayer is not a socially valued activity. Its purpose is hardly encouraged, seldom appreciated, inadequately understood and without public commendation. Little wonder that people with spiritual concerns are great doers, but infrequent at prayer.

But prayer is indispensable for the social activist. Prayer not only sustains activism, but purifies it and gives it new direction. Nouwen in this regard notes that 'if you are really praying, you can't help but have critical questions about the great problems the world is grappling with'.

If in our praying we touch the heart of God with its passion for justice and mercy and for the weak and poor of the earth, then we cannot but be given a deeper concern, a larger vision, a more radical approach and a more compassionate heart for our practical action.
