Advent Love and Christmas

The recently installed Moderator of the Uniting Church, Rev David Jackson, shared his Christmas thoughts and wishes online, and possibly in Revive as well. I offer an excerpt here. 'This year, the Lectionary readings take us to Matthew's nativity story. The author of this Gospel tells us that Mary, Joseph flee to Egypt with their baby, Jesus. King Herod has ordered his soldiers to kill all baby boys under two years of age. Joseph is warned by an angel in a dream, and the family secretly leave Bethlehem by night. This story is interpreted as a symbol of divine protection and humility. As Moderator, I have selected the flight of the Holy Family from Palestine to Egypt seeking refuge as this year's Christmas theme. My Christmas card features the quotes: "In God alone is our place of refuge" and "...build bridges rather than walls, be willing to listen and learn and not be afraid of where God might lead us in the journey towards reconciliation and healing." The ongoing displacement of individuals due to war, oppression, ethnic cleansing, or family violence is a matter of deep concern. These global crises highlight the urgent need for compassion and justice. We also are thinking of homeless people in our local communities and of the Jewish community reeling from yet another violent attack. The Holy Family sought refuge from Herod's violence, we too are called to seek and offer refuge to others. Let us pray for an end to all forms of violence and commit ourselves to choosing peace over war, joy over sorrow, hope over despair, and love over hate. Let us value every effort made in the pursuit of justice. Recalling the words of our National Anthem: "We've

We give thanks for God being with us in the love from family and friends, in whatever has been, in the circumstances of life now, and in whatever the future holds for us.


