Advent Peace

The second Sunday in Advent traditionally has 'Peace' as its theme. In the last few weeks I have spoken with people who are asking, "how long must we wait for the Kingdom of God to finally arrive? Two thousand years we have been waiting for peace, and it does not look like it has come any closer."

Sadly, people have been waiting for much longer than two thousand years. From the very beginning, people have been fighting over birthright, property, power and so on. The human condition is such that we want to be in control. and therefore we need to become more than we are, and bigger than the 'other', whom we fear. Selfishness, self-importance, self-righteousness can only change if we learn to love our neighbour as much as we love ourselves. So, we keep waiting for the Kingdom to come, or do we? Maybe the question 'when' is not the right question. Maybe we need to look around and notice where the Kingdom is already among us. 'Where' can add hope to our waiting for peace, because we don't have an answer to the question 'when?', but we can definitely see signs of the Kingdom being near. We wait for the Christ child, and we can wait in hope, if we focus on good things that are happening all around us. I have said it before, and I will keep repeating it. There is more good than evil in this world. So, focus on the hope we have in Jesus' life, death and resurrection, focus on the light, rather than the darkness that is forced upon us.
