There are other places in the world where this day is in the middle of winter. I come from a place like that, and it is still a little awkward to welcome a new year in Summer. ## Acceptance

To say it quite simply: God suffers because of us, for he wants to suffer us. This is more than a word play. Indeed, everything may be at stake in this saying: he wants to suffer us, and we are indeed suffered by him. Can we suffer those who are different from us? May the others suffer us? Can we suffer ourselves? Whom can we “not endure”? We are always causing suffering for each other: siblings, husbands and wives, parents and children, neighbours and colleagues. These spheres of suffering are deeply implicated in the church and politics. If we ourselves are not able to suffer, then nothing can possibly please us. But if we are able to suffer, then we take nothing amiss.

The love of God which is infinitely capable of suffering reaches us in Christ. His love is passion: passion for human beings and their worth, passion for the creation and its peace. Through his suffering because of us and through his death for us Christ has accepted us and brought us to the glory of God... We can mutually accept each other because Christ has accepted us to the glory of God. And because he has already accepted the others and us, the whole vista of life is opened wide before us. We stand on firm ground wherever we accept, recognise, and confirm each other. We cannot go far enough.

In view of the life that has been passionately confirmed and accepted by God, there is no longer any worthless life, no “second-class” citizen. The suffering of God’s love has changed everything, and the more we go outside of ourselves, the more we will discover and experience this change ourselves.

candles which would be lit on New Year's Eve, and a late supper, with mandarins, nuts to crack, chocolates and other delicacies, a story shared and a prayer, and then a toast with (real) champagne, this was the traditional intimate family event I still remember with great fondness and gratitude.

It is easy to forget that us Ozzies are not the centre of the universe. Not only are there millions of people celebrating the Season in the cold, there are also peoples having different days of the year they consider as New Year's Eve.

Our Orthodox Christian brothers and sisters celebrate New Year on 14<sup>th</sup> January each year, following a different calendar, as do our Jewish relatives. They observe Rosh Hashana on the first two days of the Hebrew month of Tishrei (usually September/October), when they celebrate the world's creation.

The Lunar New Year is celebrated by Chinese, Vietnamese and Korean people in their country of origin as well as in Australia with dragon dances and lanterns.

Thai Songkran New Year is celebrated from 13<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> April with lots of water, used e.g. in water fights. This water festival symbolises cleansing and washing away bad luck.

Last, and by no means least, first Australian peoples traditionally do not celebrate New Year. They follow the circular seasonal patterns, and acknowledge and mark the changes in many and varied ways across the mainland and the islands.

May we have open hearts and minds to the diverse peoples and their cultures that make up this little (in population) and big (in land size) island we call home.
