## Rediscovering Spirituality

I opened a book. 'This is the Day, readings and meditations from the Iona Community'. I here share the story I found when I opened that book this morning, in somewhat condensed form.

Orbiston is (still today) a housing scheme in Bellshill, near Glasgow, which has suffered from sectarian divisions, and economic difficulties. A Neighbourhood Centre was established to find ways to bridge the divides and to offer mutual support in the face of unemployment and disadvantage.

The approach taken was based on the principles of liberation theology. (...) Liberation theology starts with people and not dogma, with experience and not theory. Within this context church traditions are explored to discover what they can offer people rather than simply being imposed from above. This has succeeded in Orbiston by bringing people together in an ecumenical way, healing wounds of separation while acknowledging difference of denomination. The Good Samaritan's challenge to 'love thy neighbour' has been enacted by ordinary people becoming involved in the decisions of local and national government which affect their daily lives, such as the Policy of Care in the Community. Feelings of apathy and helplessness have been challenged by mutual support, prayer and accountability, in a creative and imaginative way...

Liberation theology is a term used by the Brazilian theologian Gustavo Gutierrez. It involves reading the Bible from the perspective of the poor, encouraging them to see themselves as the subjects of their own life rather than as objects of other people's understanding of them. (...) Liberation theology is a method, a process. It inquires about justice, and *does* theology, not so much in church, but rather in the street, the factory, the marketplace or parliament. The method is about 'doing'. The value/truth of an idea is

They also offer meeting space for other groups and activities. They did not start with a political agenda or a blueprint. The churches' choice did have political an economic implications. What would happen if we would do something like this in Albany?
