Compassion

Recently a 'Taste of Spirituality' group has started meeting at my place, on Thursday mornings, 10am. We share some practice, experiences and thoughts. I am interested in continuing spiritual growth and participate in online courses. Currently I am reading about and from the work of Pema Chödrön. To give you some idea of what you might come across on a Thursday morning, I share an excerpt of one e-mail here. Pema Chödrön is a Buddhist nun. She graduated from the University of California at Berkeley. She has taught and conducted meditation retreats in North America, Europe, and Australia. For Pema, sitting meditation is the basis for compassion with oneself and all beings. She teaches ways to look at ourselves clearly; touch soft spot of our hearts, and dissolve barriers that separate us from others. Her teachings help to develop a sense of sacredness and tenderness toward ourselves and the world. The teachings are grounded in the Tibetan practice of "mind training". Difficulties are transformed into insights. In this way of looking at things, intimacy with fear and chaos is the beginning of wisdom. Central to mind training are slogans, the primary focus of Pema's practice and teaching. Each slogan works as a gateway to balance and clarity, to compassion for all living beings. Here are some to choose from to work with during the next few weeks.

Write the slogan down and put it somewhere you will see it often. Notice how circumstances related to the slogan turn up in your life. Apply the slogan and notice what happens.



Unimagined Realities

I believe it to be essential for us to recover the dimension of eternity if we are to value this life properly and live it with sanity and courage.

The pieties of former ages cannot satisfy the modern mind. For example, the conception of 'eternity' as merely endless aeons of time has given many people an idea of 'heaven' which they have rejected as absurd.

Surely here the conception of another 'dimension' can come to the aid of our thought. No thinking Christian today believes in 'heaven' or 'everlasting life' as a mere extension of time and space existence, however purified or exalted! It is believed that after the death of the body there is a release from the time and space predicament and a conscious sharing in the timeless life of God, in which there are probably various stages of enlightenment and knowledge.

There may be no words to describe such a timeless state, but that proves no more than that its reality is beyond present human expression. Yet it remains that unshakeable conviction of Christians from New Testament days until today that there is what must be called, for want of a better word, an 'eternal' order, an 'eternal' plan and an 'eternal' life.

Compared with these eternal verities, the present human scene gives no more than a hint of unimagined realities.
